POSITION OF RECTOR IN TWO PARISHES

1. St John & St Chad – Zwelitsha

Managerial and leadership qualities with the humility of a servant and the heart of a pastor who cares for and loves people of any age and any position is what is looked for in this applicant.

Responsibilities: To administer the Sacraments, to solemnise Holy Matrimony, and to perform other Holy Ordinances of the Church, according to the Ritual and Rubric of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa;

Growing the Church: to develop the congregation spiritually, to be a mentor and guide, good communicator and open-minded;

Broad Management Skills: mainly to supervise pastoral care, as well as to remain relevant with modern economic challenges and their effects on the welfare of the church:

Unite the Congregation: to enhance good and effective working relations amongst the congregants, be approachable and warm, compassionate with empathy for others, should appeal to all sections of the parish (flexible), able to work with educated and uneducated people, sensitive to the opinions of the wider congregation, to pray, preach and visit sick and bereaved members, and be a team leader who encourages the development of Lay Ministers;

Strong Community Interest: to play a visible role in the public arena and with ecumenical partners, to remain relevant in modern times in all socio-politico aspects of the country;

To leave administration and finance under the care of churchwardens and parish council who will report bi-weekly to him/her on these matters.

2. St Paul's Port Alfred with St John's, in Bathurst

Situated in "Frontier country" and steeped in the history of the English Settlers of the 1820's St Paul's Port Alfred and St John's Bathurst historically stand out as being two of the last outposts of English Colonialism. However in the new and vibrant democracy they engage vibrantly with the communities in which they stand and have embraced our new South African life.

Port Alfred a seaside resort attracts retired and elderly people. Close to Grahamstown and Rhodes University the congregation of about 130 members is friendly predominantly retired group.

The congregation seeks a suitably qualified priest with the heart of a pastor and good interpersonal skills to lead and nurture a parish as Rector that serves St John's, Bathurst and two small settler churches St Mary's

at Cuylerville and St James at Southwell with St Barnabas the Xhosa speaking congregation in Port Alfred which is part of the team ministry of the area along with two outstations St Thomas at Southwell and St Mark at Kenton on Sea.

St Paul's is a training parish. Presently it has three curates, assistant priests who assist with ministry and services with particular ministry to the two retirement villages in the town.

St Paul's has good relationships with the wider church and the Rector is on the board of a CUC church at Ostrich Springs.

All clergy in our diocese are allowed to apply.
